Since 2008 he has been a visiting lecturer in EAP at the Czech University of Life Sciences, and now teaches EAP at the University of Bristol Centre for Academic Language and Development. His publications include Business English titles for Macmillan and, for OUP, the multi-level *Oxford EAP* course and the *English for Academic Purposes* title in the Oxford Handbooks for Language Teachers series.
